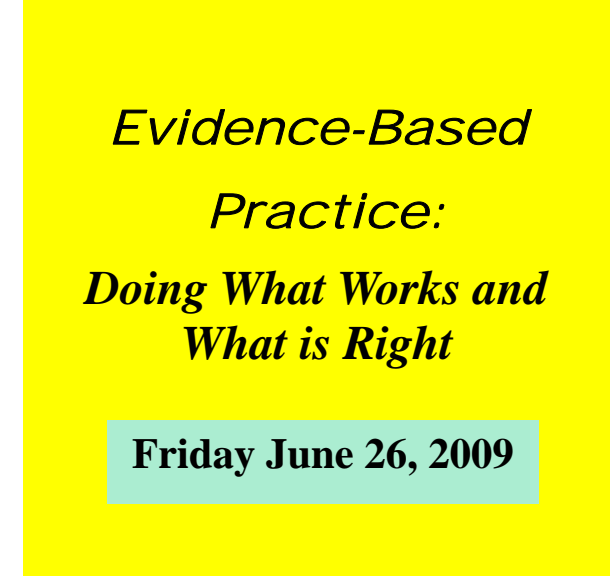

Evidence-Based Practice: *Doing What Works and What is Right*

Friday June 26, 2009

Purpose

The purpose of the conference is to apply Evidence-Based Practice (EBP) in building nursing care delivery environments of quality, safety, and excellence.

Clinicians, faculty, leaders and preceptors will learn current definitions of evidence-based practice, develop strategies to find evidence for practice, and explore what is important for getting evidence into practice. Participants will leave the workshop with a plan to advance the use of evidence to fit their setting and role.

The impact of evidence-based practice will be presented. The keynote presenter, Lisa Hopp, will address the significance and application. Panelists will discuss delivering evidence-based practice in education and practice settings. Dr. Hopp will discuss future developments and applications of EBP.

Objectives

- Connect current definitions of evidence-based practice with the best sources of evidence to inform practice.
- Relate the steps of the evidence-based practice process with resources and tools for getting evidence into practice.
- Develop a plan to prepare both the organization, its leaders and individuals at the point of care to transfer evidence to advance nursing practice.
- Provide examples of strategies to strengthen evidence-based practice at the facilitation point of care.
- Predict future development in evidence-based practice to strengthen the delivery of the quality of patient care.

Keynote Speaker:

Lisa Hopp PhD, RN

is Associate Professor, Purdue University, Calumet School of Nursing and Director of the Indiana Center for Evidence-Based Nursing Practice: A Collaborating Center of The Joanna Briggs Institute. Dr. Hopp teaches evidence-based practice in the graduate program. Her publications related to EBP can be found in *Issues in Advanced Practice*, and *Clinical Nurse Specialist*. She has provided multiple presentations locally, nationally and internationally. She received her PhD and MS, Nursing Clinical Nurse Specialist Program, from the University of Illinois at Chicago, and a BSN from Rush University, Chicago. Dr. Hopp has received the National Association of Clinical Nurse Specialist Susan B. Davidson Service Award and the Outstanding Teacher of the Year, Purdue University Calumet.
